

ORDINANCE NO. **10984**

AN ORDINANCE establishing rates and service levels for handling of white goods and clean wood at King County solid waste disposal facilities; and amending Ordinance 8891, Section 3, as amended; Ordinance 8108, Sections 3 and 4, as amended; Ordinance 6177, Section 2, as amended; and K.C.C. 10.04.020, K.C.C. 10.10.020, K.C.C. 10.10.030, and K.C.C. 10.12.020.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 8891, Section 3, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.04.020 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Definitions. The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this title:

A. "Agricultural wastes" means non-dangerous wastes on farms resulting from the production of agricultural products including but not limited to manures and carcasses of dead animals weighing each or collectively in excess of fifteen pounds.

B. "Asbestos-containing waste material" means any waste that contains asbestos. This term includes, but is not limited to, asbestos waste from control devices, contaminated clothing, asbestos waste material, materials used to enclose the work area during an asbestos project, and bags or containers that previously contained asbestos.

C. "Ashes" means the residue including any air pollution control equipment flue dusts from combustion or incineration of material including solid wastes.

D. "Bulky waste" means large items of refuse, such as appliances, furniture, and other oversize wastes which would typically not fit into reusable solid waste containers.

E. "Certified hauler or certificated hauler" means any person engaged in the business of solid waste handling having a certificate granted by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission for that purpose.

F. "Charitable organization" means any organization which meets the following criteria: must be defined by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)3 charitable organization; must be engaged as a primary form of business

1 in the processing of abandoned goods for resale or reuse; and must have an
2 account with the solid waste division.

3 G. "Clean soils and clean dredge spoils" means soils and dredge spoils
4 which are not dangerous wastes or problem wastes as defined in this
5 chapter.

6 H. Clean wood" means stumps and branches over four inches in diameter
7 and construction lumber free of paint, preservatives, metals, concrete, and
8 other non-wood additives or attachments.

9 I. "Clean wood collection area" means an area used by county residents,
10 businesses and institutions to deposit source separated clean wood.

11 ((H)) J. "Commercial hauler" means any person, firm or corporation
12 including but not limited to "certified hauler," as defined herein, collecting
13 or transporting solid waste for hire or consideration.

14 ((I)) K. "Compacted waste" means any solid waste whose volume is less
15 than in the loose condition as a result of compression.

16 ((J)) L. "Controlled solid waste" means all solid waste generated,
17 collected or disposed within the unincorporated areas of King County and all
18 solid waste generated, collected or disposed within any other jurisdiction
19 with which a solid waste interlocal agreement, as defined herein, exists.

20 ((K)) M. "Dangerous wastes" means any solid waste designated as
21 dangerous waste by the Washington State Department of Ecology under chapter
22 173-303 WAC.

23 ((L)) N. "Demolition wastes" means solid waste, largely inert waste
24 resulting from the demolition, razing or construction of buildings, roads, and
25 other man-made structures. Demolition waste consists of, but is not limited
26 to, concrete, brick, bituminous concrete, wood and masonry, composition
27 roofing and roofing paper, steel, and minor amounts of other metals like
28 copper. Plaster (i.e., sheet rock or plaster board) or any other material
29 that is likely to produce gases or a leachate during the decomposition process
30 and asbestos wastes are not considered to be demolition waste for the purposes
31 of this chapter.

32 ((M)) O. "Designated interlocal forum" means a group of representatives
33 of unincorporated King County and of incorporated cities and towns within King
34 County designated by the council of King County and by interlocal agreement
35 with the cities in King County to discuss solid waste issues and facilitate
36 regional interlocal cooperation in solid waste management.

1 ((N)) P. "Disposal" means the discharge, deposit, injection, dumping,
2 leaking, or placing of any solid waste into or on any land or water.

3 ((O)) Q. "Disposal facility" is a disposal site or interim solid waste
4 handling facility. This includes, but is not limited to, transfer stations
5 included as part of the county disposal system, landfills, incinerators,
6 composting plants, and facilities for the recycling or recovery of resources
7 from solid wastes or the conversion of the energy from such wastes to more
8 useful forms or combinations thereof.

9 ((P)) R. "Disposal site" means a site or sites approved by the council
10 of King County where any final treatment, utilization, processing or
11 disposition of solid waste occurs.

12 ((Q)) S. "Disposal system" means the system of disposal facilities,
13 rules and procedures established pursuant to this title.

14 ((R)) I. "Drop box facility" means a facility used for the placement of
15 a detachable solid waste container, i.e., drop boxes, including the area
16 adjacent for necessary entrance and exit roads, unloading, and turnaround
17 areas. Drop box facilities normally serve the general public with loose loads
18 and receive waste from off-site. Drop box facilities may also include
19 containers for separated recyclables.

20 ((S)) U. "Division" means the solid waste division of the King County
21 public works department.

22 ((T)) V. "Energy resource recovery" means the recovery of energy in a
23 usable form from mass burning or refuse derived fuel incineration, pyrolysis
24 or any other means of using the heat of combustion of solid waste that
25 involves high temperature (above 1200 degrees Fahrenheit) processing.

26 ((U)) W. "Garbage" means unwanted animal and vegetable wastes and
27 animal and vegetable wastes resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking
28 and consumption of food, swill, and carcasses of dead animals and of such a
29 character and proportion as to be capable of attracting or providing food for
30 vectors, except sewage and sewage sludge.

31 ((V)) X. "Hazardous wastes" means and includes, but is not limited to
32 explosives, medical wastes, radioactive wastes, pesticides and chemicals which
33 are potentially harmful to the public health or the environment. Unless
34 otherwise defined by the King County board of health, such waste shall have
35 the meaning as defined by the Washington State Department of Ecology and the
36 Washington Administrative Code.

1 ((W)) Y. "Hazardous waste management plan" means a plan for managing
2 moderate risk wastes, pursuant to RCW 70.105.220.

3 ((X)) Z. "Health department" means the Seattle-King County health
4 department.

5 ((Y)) AA. "Health officer" means the King County director of public
6 health, or his authorized agent.

7 ((Z)) BB. "Industrial solid wastes" means waste by-products from
8 manufacturing and fabricating operations such as scraps, trimmings, packing,
9 and other discarded materials not otherwise designated as dangerous waste
10 under Chapter 173-303 WAC.

11 ((AA)) CC. "Interim solid waste handling facility" means any interim
12 treatment, utilization or processing site engaged in solid waste handling
13 which is not the final disposal site. Transfer stations, drop boxes, baling
14 and compaction sites, source separation centers, intermediate processing
15 facilities, mixed waste processing facilities and treatment facilities are
16 considered interim solid waste handling sites.

17 ((BB.)) DD. "Intermediate processing facility" means any facility that
18 sorts mixed recyclables from source separation programs to divide them into
19 individual component recyclable materials or to process them for marketing.

20 ((GG)) EE. "King County Solid Waste Advisory Committee" means the
21 committee formed pursuant to King County Ordinance 6862 and RCW Chapter 70.95
22 to advise the county on solid waste management planning, assist in the
23 development of programs and policies concerning solid waste management, and
24 review and comment on the plan and other proposed solid waste management
25 rules, policies or ordinance prior to adoption.

26 ((DD)) FF. "Landclearing wastes" means solid wastes resulting from the
27 clearing for new construction and includes, but is not limited to, stumps and
28 other vegetation, rocks, mud and other plant or mineral wastes.

29 ((EE)) GG. "Landfill" means a disposal site or part of a site at which
30 waste is placed in or on land and which is not a landspreading disposal
31 facility.

32 ((FF)) HH. "Landspreading disposal facility" means a facility that
33 applies sludge or other solid wastes onto or incorporates solid waste into the
34 soil surface at greater than vegetative utilization and soil
35 conditioners/immobilization rates.

1 ((GG)) II. "Liquid" means a substance that flows readily and assumes
2 the form of its container but retains its independent volume.

3 ((HH)) JJ. "Littering" means to accumulate, or place, throw, deposit,
4 put into or in any land or water or otherwise dispose of refuse including
5 rubbish, ashes, garbage, dead animals, industrial refuse, commercial waste and
6 all other waste material of every kind and description in any manner except as
7 authorized by this chapter.

8 ((II)) KK. "Manager" means the manager of the solid waste division of
9 the department of public works of King County.

10 ((JJ)) LL. "Medical waste" means all waste so defined by the King
11 County board of health rules and regulations.

12 ((KK)) MM. "Mixed municipal solid waste" means waste consisting of
13 solid waste generated by residences, stores, offices, and other generators of
14 wastes that are not industrial, agricultural, or demolition wastes.

15 ((LL)) NN. "Mixed waste processing" means sorting of solid waste after
16 collection from the point of generation in order to remove recyclables from
17 the solid waste to be disposed.

18 ((MM)) OO. "Mobile yard waste facility" means a yard waste facility
19 requiring no above-grade construction and established on a temporary basis.
20 For the purposes of Section 10.12.020, a mobile yard waste facility shall be
21 considered to be a disposal site without scales.

22 ((NN)) PP. "Moderate risk waste" means:

23 1. any waste that exhibits any of the properties of hazardous waste
24 but is exempt from regulation under RCW Chapter 70.105 solely because the
25 waste is generated in quantities below the threshold for regulation, and

26 2. any household wastes which are generated from the disposal of
27 substances identified by the department of ecology as hazardous household
28 substances.

29 ((OO)) QQ. "Multi-family structure" means any residential structure
30 designed exclusively for occupancy by two or more families living
31 independently of each other receiving solid waste collection service as an
32 entire structure or complex and the structure or complex is billed for solid
33 waste collection service as a whole and not by individual dwelling units.

34 ((PP)) RR. "Noncommercial user" means any person not engaged in the
35 business of solid waste handling.

1 ((QQ)) SS. "Operating hours" means those times during which disposal
2 facilities are normally open and available for the delivery of solid wastes.

3 ((RR)) II. "Person" means any individual, association, firm,
4 corporation, partnership, political subdivision, municipality, government
5 agency, industry, public or private corporation, or any other entity.

6 ((SS)) UU. "Plan" means the coordinated comprehensive solid waste
7 management plan for the county as required by RCW Chapter 70.95.

8 ((TT)) VV. "Problem wastes" means:

9 1. soils removed during the cleanup of a remedial action site, or a
10 dangerous waste site closure or other cleanup efforts and actions and which
11 contain harmful substances but are not designated dangerous wastes, or

12 2. dredge spoils resulting from the dredging of surface waters of the
13 state where contaminants are present in the dredge spoils at concentrations
14 not suitable for open water disposal and the dredge spoils are not dangerous
15 wastes and are not regulated by the Federal Clean Water Act.

16 ((UU)) WW. "Procurement policy" means the development and
17 implementation of a policy which achieves the purchase of products made from
18 recycled and/or recyclable goods.

19 ((VV)) XX. "Receivers" means persons who will reuse recyclables and to
20 whom source separated recyclables for which a market does not presently exist
21 can be delivered at little or no cost in order to avoid landfilling the
22 materials pending development of economic markets.

23 ((WW)) YY. "Reclamation site" means a location used for the processing
24 or the storage of recycled waste.

25 ((XX)) ZZ. "Recyclables" means any material that can be kept out of or
26 recovered from solid waste and the resources therein be transformed and/or
27 reused including, but not limited to, mixed paper, newsprint, cardboard,
28 aluminum, glass, plastics, chemicals, oil, wood, compostable organics (food
29 and yard debris), ferrous metal, and inorganics (rubble and inert material).

30 ((YY)) AAA. "Recycling" means either source separation or the
31 processing of solid waste mechanically or by hand to segregate materials for
32 sale or reuse. Materials which can be removed through recycling include but
33 are not limited to mixed paper, newsprint, cardboard, aluminum, glass,
34 plastics, chemicals, oil, wood, compostable organics (food and yard debris),
35 ferrous metal, and inorganics (rubble and inert material). Recycling does not
36 include combustion of solid waste or preparation of a fuel from solid waste.

1 ((ZZ)) BBB. "Refuse" means garbage, rubbish, ashes, swill and all other
2 putrescible and nonputrescible wastes, except sewage, from all public and
3 private establishments and residences.

4 ((AAA)) CCC. "Regional approach" means the development and
5 implementation of a solid waste management program in cooperation with
6 municipalities in King County and with other counties within the Puget Sound
7 area.

8 ((BBB)) DDD. "Regional direct" means any solid waste transported to
9 Cedar Hills disposal site by conventional long haul transfer vehicles,
10 transporting from solid waste transfer stations solid waste generated and
11 collected in King County.

12 EEE. "Regulated refrigerant" means a class I or class II substance as
13 listed in Title VI of the Federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990.

14 ((GGG)) FFF. "Reuse" means the return of a commodity into the economic
15 stream for use.

16 ((DDD)) GGG. "Rubbish" means all nonputrescible wastes from all public
17 and private establishments and from all residences.

18 ((EEE)) HHH. "Secured load" means a load of solid waste which has been
19 secured or covered in the vehicle in a manner that will prevent any part of
20 the solid waste from leaving the vehicle while the vehicle is moving.

21 ((FFF)) III. "Self-hauler" means all vehicles that are neither
22 passenger licensed vehicles nor vehicles used by solid waste collection
23 entities in their solid waste collection operations.

24 ((GGG)) JJJ. "Single family dwelling" means any residential unit
25 receiving solid waste collection service as an individual unit and the
26 dwelling is billed for solid waste collection service as an individual
27 dwelling.

28 ((HHH)) KKK. "Solid waste" means all putrescible and nonputrescible
29 solid and semisolid wastes, except wastes identified in WAC 173-304-015,
30 including but not limited to garbage, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes,
31 swill, demolition and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles or parts
32 thereof, discarded commodities, sludge from wastewater treatment plants and
33 septage from septic tanks, woodwaste, dangerous waste, and problem wastes.
34 This includes all liquid, solid and semisolid materials which are not the
35 primary products of public, private, industrial, commercial, mining and

1 agricultural operations. Unrecovered residue from recycling operations shall
2 be considered solid waste.

3 ((III)) LLL. "Solid waste collection entity" means every person or his
4 lessees, receivers, or trustees, owning, controlling, operating or managing
5 vehicles used in the business of transporting solid waste for collection
6 and/or disposal for compensation including all certified haulers, or any city
7 using its own employees, or any company operating pursuant to a contract with
8 or franchise from a city performing solid waste collection services within the
9 city.

10 ((JJJ)) MMM. "Solid waste interlocal agreement" means an agreement
11 between a city and the county for use of King County disposal system for solid
12 waste generated or collected within the city.

13 ((KKK)) NNN. "Solid waste management" means the systematic
14 administration of activities which provide for the reduction in generated
15 volume, source separation, collection, storage, transportation, transfer,
16 recycling, processing, treatment and disposal of solid waste. This includes
17 public education and marketing activities.

18 ((LLL)) OOO. "Source separation" means the process of separating
19 recyclable materials from material which will become solid waste at its
20 source.

21 ((MMM)) PPP. "Suspect waste" means any waste the manager suspects may
22 be unauthorized waste.

23 ((NNN)) QQQ. "Swill" means every refuse accumulation of animal, fruit
24 or vegetable matter, liquid or otherwise, that attend the preparation, use,
25 cooking, dealing in or storing of meat, fish, fowl, fruit and vegetables,
26 except coffee grounds.

27 RRR. "Trailer Waste Area" means a dedicated area where disposal
28 vehicles shall utilize for hosing their containers, truck beds, and trailers
29 following tipping of wastes.

30 ((OOO)) SSS. "Transfer station" means a staffed, fixed, supplemental
31 collection and transportation facility used by persons and route collection
32 vehicles to deposit collected solid waste from off-site into a larger transfer
33 vehicle for transport to a permanent disposal site. It may also include
34 recycling facilities.

1 ((PPP)) III. "Unauthorized waste" means waste which is waste not
2 acceptable for disposal at any or a specific disposal facility according to
3 applicable rules and regulations or a determination of the manager.

4 ((QQQ)) UUU. "Uncompacted waste" means any solid waste in an
5 uncompressed or loose condition.

6 ((RRR)) VVV. "Unincorporated urban service area" means a geographical
7 area of urban unincorporated King County designated to receive solid waste,
8 recyclables, and yard waste collection services.

9 ((SSS)) WWW. "Waste reduction" means reducing the amount or type of
10 waste generated.

11 XXX. "White goods" means major appliances, including refrigerators,
12 freezers, heat pumps, air conditioners, stoves, ranges, dishwashers, washers,
13 dryers, trash compactors, dehumidifiers, and other appliances specified by the
14 manager.

15 YYY. "White goods collection area" means an area used by county
16 residents to deposit source separated white goods.

17 ((TTT)) ZZZ. "Woodwaste" means solid waste consisting of wood pieces or
18 particles generated as a by-product resulting from the handling and processing
19 of wood, including, but not limited to, hog fuel, sawdust, shavings, chips,
20 bark, small pieces of wood, stumps, limbs and any other material composed
21 largely of wood which has no significant commercial value at the time in
22 question, (but shall not include slash developed from logging operations
23 unless disposed of on a different site), and does not include wood pieces or
24 particles containing chemical preservatives such as creosote,
25 pentachlorophenol, or copper-chrome-arsenate.

26 ((UUU)) AAAA. "Yard waste" means a compostable organic material
27 generated in yards or gardens, including but not limited to, leaves, grass,
28 branches, prunings, and clippings of woody and fleshy plants and unflocked
29 Christmas trees, but shall not include rocks, dirt or sod, concrete, asphalt,
30 bricks, landclearing wastes, demolition wastes, woodwaste or food waste.

31 ((VVV)) BBBB. "Yard waste ((facility)) collection area" means an area ~~((facility))~~
32 used by county residents, businesses, and institutions to deposit source
33 separated yard waste.

34 SECTION 2. Ordinance 8108, Section 3, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.10.020
35 are hereby amended to read as follows:

1 Operating hours at King County solid waste disposal facilities shall be
2 as follows:

3 A. Transfer stations shall be open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.,
4 Sundays through Saturdays. The Factoria transfer station shall also be open
5 at night from 5:30 p.m. to 1:00 a.m., Monday through Friday.

6 1. Yard waste ((~~facilities~~)) collection areas shall be located at
7 the following transfer stations and shall be open at the hours here specified:
8 Factoria Transfer Station....5:30 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. Monday through Friday;
9 Enumclaw Transfer Station....8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Sunday through Saturday.

10 2. White goods and clean wood collection areas shall be located at
11 the following transfer stations and shall be open at the hours here specified:
12 Enumclaw Transfer Station....8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Sunday through Saturday.

13 B. The Cedar Hills Landfill shall be open from 6:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
14 Mondays through Fridays, 6:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays. Cedar
15 Hills shall not be open for use by the general public.

16 C. All King County solid waste disposal facilities shall be closed on
17 Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Years Day.

18 D. King County landfills (excluding Cedar Hills), drop boxes, and
19 yard waste ((~~facilities~~)) collection areas located at landfills shall be open
20 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., seven days per week during Pacific Standard Time
21 and from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., seven days per week during Pacific Daylight
22 Time. Yard waste ((~~facilities~~)) collection areas shall be located at Hobart
23 and Cedar Falls landfills.

24 E. Operating hours, dates of operation, and sites for mobile yard
25 waste facilities shall be determined and publicized by the manager.

26 SECTION 3. Ordinance 8108, Section 4, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.10.030
27 are hereby amended to read as follows:

28 Types of waste accepted. Types of waste accepted at King County solid
29 waste disposal facilities shall be limited to the following:

30 A. Cedar Hills Landfill shall accept mixed municipal solid waste from
31 transfer stations and other sources in King County, and demolition waste in
32 small quantities incidental to jurisdictional activities.

33 B. Rural landfills shall accept mixed municipal solid waste from
34 nonurban sources.

35 C. Transfer stations shall accept mixed municipal solid waste,
36 demolition waste in small quantities incidental to jurisdictional activities

1 and of a size and density capable of being handled by transfer station
2 equipment, and waste from the general public, businesses, and route collection
3 vehicles collecting waste in King County.

4 D. Drop box facilities shall accept mixed municipal solid waste in
5 loads not to exceed five cubic yards and/or one ton.

6 E. Yard waste ((facilities)) collection areas located at county
7 transfer stations or landfills shall accept source separated yard waste from
8 county residents, businesses and institutions.

9 F. Mobile yard waste facilities shall accept source separated
10 residential yard waste from noncommercial users in loads not to exceed five
11 cubic yards and/or one ton.

12 G. White goods collection areas located at county transfer stations
13 or landfills shall accept source separated white goods from county residents.

14 H. Clean wood collection areas located at county transfer stations or
15 landfills shall accept source separated clean wood from county residents,
16 businesses and institutions.

17 ((G)) I. Other wastes, such as industrial waste, semisolid, or liquid
18 waste, and asbestos containing waste material, may be accepted at sites as
19 designated and approved by the manager.

20 ((H)) J. Acceptance of any suspect waste may be denied pending the
21 health officer's approval.

22 SECTION 4. Ordinance 6177, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.12.020
23 are hereby amended to read as follows:

24 Fees for use of disposal sites. All persons using county-operated solid
25 waste disposal facilities shall pay the service fees set forth in the
26 following schedules:

27 A. Effective ((January 1, 1992)) September 1, 1993 service fees for
28 the use of disposal sites with scales, excluding Cedar Hills, shall be:

29 1. Solid waste disposal:

30	Passenger licensed vehicles.....	\$9.25 per entry
31	Other vehicles	66.00 per ton
32	Charitable organizations	43.00 per ton
33	Minimum charge	9.25 per vehicle
34	Charitable organizations, minimum charge	6.00 per entry
35	<u>Use of Trailer Wash Area</u>	<u>1.00 per token</u>

1 2. Deposit of source separated yard waste at ((disposal sites
2 with)) yard waste ((facilities)) collection areas and deposit of clean wood at
3 clean wood collection areas:

- 4 Passenger licensed vehicles 7.50 per entry
- 5 Other vehicles 58.00 per ton
- 6 Minimum charge 7.50 per vehicle

7 3. Deposit of white goods at white goods collection areas:

- 8 White goods without regulated refrigerants 10.00 per unit
- 9 White goods with regulated refrigerants 24.00 per unit

10 B. Effective January 1, 1992 service fees for the use of disposal
11 sites without scales shall be based upon the cubic yard or fraction thereof as
12 follows:

13 1. Solid waste disposal:

- 14 Passenger licensed vehicles \$9.25 per entry
- 15 Other vehicles
- 16 Compacted wastes 19.00 per cubic yard
- 17 Uncompacted wastes 11.00 per cubic yard
- 18 Minimum charge 9.25 per vehicle

19 2. Deposit of source separated yard waste at ((disposal sites
20 with)) yard waste ((facilities)) collection areas:

- 21 Passenger licensed vehicles 7.50 per entry
- 22 Other vehicles
- 23 Compacted wastes 17.00 per cubic yard
- 24 Uncompacted wastes 9.50 per cubic yard
- 25 Minimum charge 7.50 per vehicle

26 C. Effective January 1, 1992 service fees at the Cedar Hills Landfill
27 shall be:

- 28 Cedar Hills regional direct 43.00 per ton
- 29 Other vehicles 66.00 per ton

30 Disposal by other vehicles is at the discretion of the solid waste
31 manager. Any certificated hauler who has been disposing solid waste at a
32 rural landfill may be authorized by the solid waste manager to dispose solid
33 waste at the Cedar Hills Regional Landfill on a temporary, emergency basis at
34 the regional direct fee.

1 D. Effective July 1, 1991, a moderate risk waste surcharge shall be
2 added to all solid waste disposed by non-solid waste collection entities using
3 county operated disposal facilities. The fee schedule is as follows:

- 4 1. For sites with scales:
 - 5 Self-haulers \$2.61 per ton
 - 6 Minimum charge 1.00 per entry
 - 7 Passenger licensed vehicles 1.00 per entry
- 8 2. For sites without scales:
 - 9 Compacted76 per cubic yard
 - 10 Uncompacted44 per cubic yard
 - 11 Minimum charge..... 1.00 per entry

26 facilities as provided by this chapter may only be disposed of in a King
27 County facility upon payment of a special service fee of 3 times the
28 applicable per ton rate for facilities with scales and 3 times the applicable
29 cubic yard rate for compacted or uncompacted wastes for facilities without
30 scales. Payment of the special service fee in this subsection shall be in
