ORDINANCE NO. 12555

AN ORDINANCE relating to the King County Standardized Salary Schedule and the annual cost-of-living increase for non-represented King County employees as stipulated in K.C.C. 3.12.130 and K.C.C. 3.12.140.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The attached King County Standardized Salary Schedule, entitled "Schedule of Pay Ranges and Steps in Annual, Monthly, and Semi-Monthly Amounts and Hourly Rates," is approved and adopted.

SECTION 2. Employees of the King County district courts, King County superior court, and the King County council shall have their salaries increased by 2.7% effective January 1, 1997. This increase shall not apply to elected officials, superior court commissioners, superior court administrator, district court administrator, or those employees who are in a collective bargaining unit.

SECTION 3. Non-represented employees of the King County prosecuting attorney's office shall be eligible to receive a cost-of-living adjustment determined by the prosecuting attorney effective January 1, 1997. The amount to be applied shall be determined by increasing the aggregate salary base in effect prior to the effective date by an amount of 2.7%.

SECTION 4. Employees of the executive branch, non-elected employees of the
