# ORDINANCE NO. 12618

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the vacation of a portion of South 259th Place and denying the vacation of South 260th Street - V-2155

Petitioners: Donald and Nadine Masoero.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting the vacation of portions of South 259th Place and South 260th Street.
- 2. King County acquired south 259th Place from the State of Washington, department of transportation by quit claim deed recorded under recording number 8505070897. A search of King County records revealed that the County acquired portions of South 260th Street by various deeds recorded in 1922.
- 3. The department of transportation, road services division has notified the various utilities serving the area and easements were secured by Puget Sound Power & Light Company and Highline Water District. No other easements are required.
- 4. The land use services division of the department of development and environmental services has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that South 259th Place is classified as a principal arterial, requiring a minimum of 84 feet of right of way width. The land use services division recommends the vacation of the portion of South 259th Place right of way lying southerly of a line 42 feet south of the road centerline. The vacation would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan or any specific plans in the vicinity. The land use services division recommends denying the vacation request for South 260th Street. South 260th Street right of way may provide access for future subdivision and development in the area.
- 5. The traffic engineering and transportation system planning sections concur with the land use services division and recommend the vacation of South 259th Place and denial of the request for South 260th Street.
- 6. The department of transportation, road services division recommends vacation of the portion of South 259th Place and denial of the vacation request for South 260th Street and hereinafter described. The department of transportation believes the public would benefit by the return of this portion of the subject right of way to the public tax rolls.
- 7. The council finds that the right of way is classified C-Class and, in accordance with King County Code 14.40.020. The compensation due King County is based on fifty percent of the assessed value of the adjoining lands which may be determined from records of the department of

### ORDINANCE NO. 12618

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the vacation of a portion of South 259th Place and denying the vacation of South 260th Street - V-2155 Petitioners: Donald and Nadine Masoero.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting the vacation of portions of South 259th Place and South 260th Street.
- 2. King County acquired south 259th Place from the State of Washington, department of transportation by quit claim deed recorded under recording number 8505070897. A search of King County records revealed that the County acquired portions of South 260th Street by various deeds recorded in 1922.
- 3. The department of transportation, road services division has notified the various utilities serving the area and easements were secured by Puget Sound Power & Light Company and Highline Water District. No other easements are required.
- 4. The land use services division of the department of development and environmental services has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that South 259th Place is classified as a principal arterial, requiring a minimum of 84 feet of right of way width. The land use services division recommends the vacation of the portion of South 259th Place right of way lying southerly of a line 42 feet south of the road centerline. The vacation would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan or any specific plans in the vicinity. The land use services division recommends denying the vacation request for South 260th Street. South 260th Street right of way may provide access for future subdivision and development in the area.
- 5. The traffic engineering and transportation system planning sections concur with the land use services division and recommend the vacation of South 259th Place and denial of the request for South 260th Street.
- 6. The department of transportation, road services division recommends vacation of the portion of South 259th Place and denial of the vacation request for South 260th Street and hereinafter described. The department of transportation believes the public would benefit by the return of this portion of the subject right of way to the public tax rolls.
- 7. The council finds that the right of way is classified C-Class and, in accordance with King County Code 14.40.020. The compensation due King County is based on fifty percent of the assessed value of the adjoining lands which may be determined from records of the department of

assessments. King County is in receipt of \$1,250.61 from the petitioner, which exceeds the amount due to King County.

- 8. The petition contained signatures of additional property owners requesting vacation of the subject right of ways. Petitioners Warren and Juanita Beecroft, Walter and Ester Witter, and Benton and Marion Bangs elected not to pay the compensation for the vacation of South 259th Place.
- 9. The petitioners Leland and Rita Capp, Donald and Nadine Masoero, Warren and Juanita Beecroft, Walter and Ester Witter, and Benton and Marion Bangs are appealing the recommendation to deny the vacation of the portion of South 260th Street as part of this action.
- 10. The petitioners Leland and Rita Capp, Donald and Nadine Masoero, Warren and Juanita Beecroft, Walter and Ester Witter, and Benton and Marion Bangs are appealing the compensation required for the vacation request.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law, and a hearing was commenced by the office of the hearing examiner on October 21, 1996.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant a modified petition.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1: The Council, on the 24th day of January

1997, hereby vacates and abandons that portion of South 259th Place described as follows:

That portion of South 259th Place lying Southerly of a line 42 feet South of the Centerline of said South 259th Place, and lying adjacent to that parcel of land conveyed to Donald J.Masoero and Nadine L. Masoero, recorded under Recording Number 8706180808, records of King County, Washington.

Containing an area of 1,372 square feet more or less.

SECTION 2. The council hereby rejects the appeal of Leland and Rita Capp, Donald and Nadine Masoero, Warren and Juanita Beecroft, Walter and Ester Witter, and Benton and Marion Bangs of the department of transportation denial for the vacation of that portion of South 260th Street described as follows:

That portion of South 260th Street lying westerly of the west margin of Military Road South and east of the west line of the Southwest quarter of Section 27, Township 22 North, Range 4 East, and W.M., King County, Washington.

SECTION 3. The council, hereby concurs with the appeal of Donald and Nadine Masoero, Warren and Juanita Beecroft, Walter and Ester Witter, and Benton and Marion Bangs regarding the determination of compensation and finds that the compensation determination made by the department of transportation and the examiner is in error. In accordance with King County Code 14.40, South 259th Place is recognized by the Council as "Class C" right of way. In addition, the department may revise the compensation downward consistent with examiner's recommendation B., if appropriate. After having taken both of these determinations into consideration, the department of transportation is directed to refund that portion of the \$1250.61 right of way compensation deposit which is due to Donald and Nadine Masoero.
