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pursuant to plans approved by the County and for providing mitigation for the proposed roads.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Findings

A. For the purpose of accomplishing the goals of the Countywide Planning Policies, the 1994 King County Comprehensive Plan, and the Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan the metropolitan King County council makes the following legislative findings:

1. King County adopted the Countywide Planning Policies, the 1994 King County Comprehensive Plan and the Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan to meet the requirements of the Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA).

2. The metropolitan King County council established a 4 to 1 program under Countywide Planning Policy FW-1, Step 7, and further described in the 1994 King County Comprehensive Plan (KCCP), policies I-204 and I-205, to actively pursue the dedication of open space along the Urban Growth Area Line of the County.

3. The Central Puget Sound Growth Management Hearings Board, in the Vashon-Maury, et al. v. King County case, upheld the County's 4 to 1 Program, calling the 4 to 1 Program "the type of innovative land use management technique that the Act (GMA) encourages."

1 4. The King County Parks, Recreation and Open Space
2 Plan policies F-101, PR-101, and PR-102 describe the vision
3 for the King County parks, open space, and recreation system.
4 The policies state that King County will be a regional
5 provider of parks, open spaces and recreation programs with a
6 major focus on systems of open space corridors that conserve
7 natural resources and provide recreation opportunities, fish
8 and wildlife habitat, and scenic beauty.

9 5. The open spaces to be dedicated to the county as
10 part of the 4 to 1 Program proposals will provide valuable
11 benefit to the public and to the county's park and open space
12 system consistent with the King County Park, Recreation and
13 Open Space Plan.

14 SECTION 2. Ordinance 6798, Section 26, as amended and
15 K.C.C. 7.12.260 is hereby amended to read as follows:
16 Motorized vehicles on roads and trails. No person shall
17 operate any motor vehicle on a trail in any King County park
18 area unless such trail has been specifically designated and
19 posted for such use. No person shall operate a motor vehicle
20 within the boundaries of a King County park area except on
21 roads, streets, highways, parking lots, parking areas, or
22 where otherwise permitted by proper posting. Through traffic
23 is not permitted within the boundaries of any King County
24 park or open space, except for two roads through Petrovitsky
25 Park, if due to the topography, surrounding development
26 patterns, and road networks, the two roads provide the only

1 feasible access to the 4 to 1 Project known as McGarvey Park.

2
3 Provided that:

4 This section shall not apply to emergency vehicles,
5 maintenance vehicles, or construction vehicles authorized by
6 the department.
