ORDINANCE NO.

**12949**

AN ORDINANCE approving and adopting the Memorandum of Agreement negotiated by and between King County and Joint Crafts Council, representing employees in the stadium construction crafts; and establishing the effective date of said Agreement.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The Memorandum of Agreement negotiated between King County and the Joint Crafts Council, representing employees in the stadium construction crafts, attached hereto is hereby approved and adopted and by this reference made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. Terms and conditions of said agreement shall be effective from September 1, 1997, through and including sixty (60) days prior to the Kingdome ceasing to operate.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

12949

The parties to this agreement, the Joint Crafts Council, (the Union) and King County, (the employer) agree to the following matters relating to the employees of the Kingdome covered by the Joint Craft Council's Kingdome Construction Crafts Agreement and employees of King County covered by the Joint Craft Council's Joint Construction Craft Agreement. The parties agree to the following provisions in order to assure appropriate staffing at the Kingdome until such time that the Kingdome is no longer in operation:

1. The employees covered by the Kingdome Construction Crafts Agreement will commence to accrue seniority under their respective bargaining units within the Joint Construction Crafts Agreement effective September 1, 1997.
2. The employer will select qualified applicants for positions in King County from applicants employed under the Kingdome Construction Agreement until such time that all current employees are placed in County positions. If any employees so placed are "loaned back" to and continue to actually work in the Kingdome, their work will be performed in accordance with the terms and conditions in the Kingdome Construction Craft Agreement until such time as they perform in their newly placed position.
3. Employees covered by the Kingdome Construction Craft Agreement shall be afforded access to the OHRM placement process as well as afforded training opportunities as budgetary constraints and operational needs allow in order to become qualified for other County positions
4. If sixty (60) days prior to the Kingdome ceasing to operate, any covered employees have not been placed in other positions, the County and the bargaining agent agree to meet to negotiate the impact for each employee.
