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ORDINANCE NO. **13242**

AN ORDINANCE establishing the date for an election on the question of annexation of the city of Lake Forest Park into the King County Rural Library District, and declaring an emergency.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The city of Lake Forest Park, Washington by Ordinance No. 741 has initiated the proposed annexation and expressed its intent to join the King County Rural Library District, finding that the public interest will be served thereby.

City of Lake Forest Park Ordinance No. 741 satisfies the provisions of RCW 27.12.010 (5), and 27.12.360 and requests the calling of an election to be held among the qualified voters therein.

The Board of Trustees of the King County Rural Library District by Resolution No. 1998-6 has concurred with the proposal in accordance with RCW 27.12.360.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A special election shall be held on the 15th day of September, 1998, within the city of Lake Forest Park. The ballot proposition shall be in substantially the following form in accordance with RCW 27.12.370:

“Shall the city of Lake Forest Park, Washington be annexed to and be part of the King County Rural Library District?

SECTION 2. The King County manager of the records and elections division is hereby requested to assume jurisdiction and conduct a special election and submit to the registered voters within the subject area the proposition set forth in Section 1 of this

1 ordinance. The clerk of the council is hereby authorized and directed to transmit said
2 proposition to the manager of records and elections in substantially the above form, with
3 such additions, deletions, or modifications
4 in the ballot title as may be required for the proposition by the King County Prosecuting
5 Attorney. Notice of the election shall be published as required by law.

6 SECTION 3. The council hereby finds as a fact and declares that an emergency
7 exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,
8 health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public institutions.

ORDINANCE NO. 741

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAKE FOREST PARK, WASHINGTON, DECLARING THE CITY'S INTENT TO JOIN AND BE ANNEXED TO THE KING COUNTY RURAL LIBRARY DISTRICT; REQUESTING THE CONCURRENCE OF THE LIBRARY DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES; AND REQUESTING THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL TO CALL AN ELECTION IN THE CITY ON THE PROPOSITION OF WHETHER THE CITY SHOULD BE ANNEXED TO THE LIBRARY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lake Forest Park has determined to submit a ballot proposition to the voters of the City to authorize annexation of the City by the King County Rural Library District; and

WHEREAS, the City Library Board has been notified of this proposed annexation, and that board recommends that the city be annexed by the Library District; and

WHEREAS, RCW 27.12.360 provides that the process of annexation is initiated by an ordinance of the City Council stating the City's intent to join the Library District, finding that the public interest will be served thereby, notifying the Library District of the proposed ordinance, and requesting that District's support for the annexation; and

WHEREAS, if the Library District concurs in the annexation, notification thereof shall be transmitted to the King County Council which shall then call an election to be held in the City at the time and in the manner provided in RCW 27.12.370; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKE FOREST PARK, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Declaration of Intent and Finding. The City of Lake Forest Park hereby declares its intent to join and be annexed to the King County Rural Library District; and, after reviewing the options for providing library service to the residents of the City, the City Council finds that the public interest will best be served by annexation of the City to the Library District.

Section 2. Request for Concurrence of Library District. The City Council requests that the Board of Trustees of the King County Rural

Library District concur in the proposed annexation of the City to the Library District. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this ordinance to the Board of Trustees of the Library District.

Section 3. Transmittal to County Council and Request for Election. If the Board of Trustees of the King County Rural Library District concurs in the annexation, then, pursuant to RCW 27.12.360 and 27.12.370, the City Clerk is authorized and directed to send a certified copy of this Ordinance and a copy of the Library District's concurrence to the King County Council. The King County Council is requested to call by resolution an election to be held in the City of Lake Forest Park on September 15, 1998, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City the proposition of whether the City should annex to the King County Rural Library District. The King County Council is also requested to give notice of the election as provided in RCW 29.27.080. The proposition to be submitted at the special election shall be in the form of a ballot title as follows:

PROPOSITION

ANNEXATION OF THE CITY OF LAKE FOREST PARK
TO THE KING COUNTY RURAL LIBRARY DISTRICT

Shall the City of Lake Forest Park be annexed to and be a part of the King County Rural Library District?

Section 4. Annexation. If a majority of persons voting on the annexation proposition vote in favor of annexation, then the City of Lake Forest Park shall be annexed to and constitute a part of the King County Rural Library District effective immediately upon certification of the results of the election.



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

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE KING COUNTY RURAL LIBRARY DISTRICT CONCURRING, SUBJECT TO CONDITION, WITH THE ANNEXATION OF THE CITY OF LAKE FOREST PARK INTO THE KING COUNTY RURAL LIBRARY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the City of Lake Forest Park has passed an ordinance which initiates the process for a special election to determine whether Lake Forest Park shall be annexed into the King County Rural Library District, and

WHEREAS, RCW 27.12 provides a process for the annexation of cities and towns into rural library districts, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees believes that the annexation would be in the best interest of all involved, and

WHEREAS, the several steps to be taken to meet the boundary changes requirements necessitate the taking of this action by the Library District.

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ORDINANCE NO. **13243**

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AN ORDINANCE establishing the date of an election on the question of annexation to the City of Shoreline of an area known as Annexation Area A-3, and declaring an emergency.

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FINDINGS OF FACT:

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1. In accordance with RCW 35A.14, the city of Shoreline, by Resolution No. 146 has determined that the best interests and general welfare of the city would be served by the annexation of an area known as Annexation Area A-3, as more fully described in city of Shoreline Resolution 146.
2. City of Shoreline Resolution No. 146 satisfies the provisions of RCW 35A.14 for qualification for annexation.
3. The city of Shoreline, by Resolution No. 146 initiated the annexation of the area known as Annexation Area A-3.
4. Since the King County boundary review board received no request for review as specified in chapter 36.93 RCW, on June 6, 1998 the Review Board, in file 2024, deemed the proposed city of Shoreline - A-3 annexation file approved.
5. Pursuant to RCW 29.13 and 35A.14, the metropolitan King County council deems an emergency exists for the purpose of calling a special election to be held on the question of this annexation on September 15, 1998.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

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SECTION 1. An election shall be held on the 15th day of September, 1998 in

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accordance with RCW 35A.14 within the territory of the proposed annexation, for the

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purpose of submitting the question of annexation of an area known as Annexation Area A-3.

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SECTION 2. The number of registered voters within the subject area is estimated

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at 645 as nearly as may be determined from available records.

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SECTION 3. The King County manager of the records and elections division is hereby requested to assume jurisdiction to call and conduct a special election and submit to the registered voters within the subject area the proposition as set forth in Section 4 of this ordinance. The clerk of the council is hereby authorized and directed to transmit said proposition to the manager of records and elections in substantially the following form, with such additions, deletions or modifications in the ballot title as may be required for the proposition listed below by the King County Prosecutor:

PROPOSITION 1: Shall the area of unincorporated King County contiguous to the city of Shoreline commonly known as Annexation Area A-3, which is legally described in King County ordinance _____ and city of Shoreline Resolution No. 146, be annexed to and become part of the city of Shoreline?

SECTION 4. The boundaries of the territory proposed for annexation are hereby described in city of Shoreline Resolution No. 146 as contained in Attachment "A" of this ordinance.

RESOLUTION NO. 146

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, INITIATING ANNEXATION OF AN AREA CONTIGUOUS TO THE CITY, REQUESTING THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL TO CALL AN ELECTION THEREON ON SEPTEMBER 15, 1998 AND REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 141

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Chapter 35A.14 RCW the City Council of the City of Shoreline hereby finds and determines that the best interests and general welfare of the City would be served by the annexation to the City of certain unincorporated territory contiguous to the City bounded by NE 205th St., 30th Ave NE, the boundaries of the proposed Lake Forest Park annexation initiated through Lake Forest Park Resolution No. 517, the Lake Forest Park City Limits, the boundaries of the proposed Lake Forest Park annexation initiated through Lake Forest Park Resolution No. 516, and the Shoreline City Limits.

The legal description of such area is approximately as follows:

Beginning at a point 30' south and 30' west of the northeast corner of Section 5, Township 26, Range 4 north, W.M. King County said point also being the intersection of the southerly margin of NE 205th Street and the existing city limits of the City of Shoreline as established by K.C.C. Ordinance No. 11382;

Thence northerly to the centerline of NE 205th Street;

Thence easterly along the centerline of NE 205th Street to the point of intersection with the existing city limits of Lake Forest Park as established by L.F.P. Ordinance No. 628;

Thence southerly following the existing city limits of Lake Forest Park as established by said ordinance to a point 201.00 feet more or less east of the southeast corner of Lot 5 of the Plat of Aldercrest Terrace, Volume 77, Page 73, Records of King County;

Thence west along the easterly extension of the south line of said plat to the southeast corner of said plat;

Thence west along the south line of said plat to the southwest corner of said plat;

Thence continue west along the south line and its westerly extension to the southeasterly line of the 150-foot-wide, City of Seattle transmission line easement;

Thence southeasterly along said line to the north margin of NE 200th Street;

Thence westerly along said margin to the west line of the Plat of Alder Crest, Volume 52, Pages 52 & 53, Records of King County;

Thence northerly along said west line to the northeast corner of Lot 10 of Frauenthal Bros. Tracts Unrecorded;

Thence westerly along the north line of Lots 10, 16, 15, and 14 of said tracts;

Thence southerly along the west line of Lot 14 of said tracts to the northeast corner of Lot 3 of King County Short Plat No. 380012, A.F. 8007100678;

Thence westerly along the north line of said lot to the east margin of 19th Avenue NE;

Thence southerly along said margin to the existing city limits of Lake Forest Park as established by L.F.P. Ordinance No. 153;

Thence westerly following the proposed city limits of Lake Forest Park as established said ordinance to a point along the southerly margin of NE 196th Street, said point being 35 feet southwest of the northeast corner of Lot 3, Block 2, Rose Addition Division No. 1, Recorded Vol 34, Page 19 Records of King County;

Thence southwesterly along the southerly margin of NE 196th Street to the point of intersection with the existing city limits of the City of Shoreline as established by K.C.C. Ordinance No. 11382;

Thence westerly and northerly following the existing city limits of the City of Shoreline as established by said ordinance to the point of beginning.

Section 2. The King County Council and the County Auditor are requested to place the question of annexation of the above described area to the City on the primary election to be held September 15, 1998. The City will pay the cost of the election.

Section 3. The number of voters residing in such area is found to be 645.

Section 4. The property proposed to be annexed will be zoned in district identical to, or comparable to, current King County zoning districts. The proposed zoning is shown on the zoning map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 5. Pursuant to RCW 35A.14.231 which precludes annexation of territory proposed for annexation by another city, and the City of Lake Forest Park Resolution No. 517 calling for the annexation of a portion of Area A proposed for annexation by the City of Shoreline through Resolution No. 141, the City Council of the City of Shoreline hereby finds and determines that the best interest and general welfare of the City would be served by repealing Resolution No. 141. Therefore, Resolution No. 141 is hereby repealed.


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Section 6. Certified copies of this Resolution shall be filed immediately with the King County Boundary Review Board and King County Council with an appropriate Notice of Intent to annex.


