ORDINANCE NO. 13326

AN ORDINANCE relating to the reorganization of the department of community and human services and the Seattle-King County department of public health and making a technical correction to a fund manager designation; amending Ordinance 11955, Section 6, and K.C.C. 2.16.130, Ordinance 12529, Section 2, and K.C.C. 2.16.080, Ordinance 12076, Section 10, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.08.025 and adding a new section to K.C.C. chapter 4.08.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 11955, Section 6, and K.C.C 2.16.130 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Department of community and human services. A. The department of community and human services is responsible to manage and be fiscally accountable for the community services division, mental health (~~and substance abuse services~~) division, alcohol and substance abuse treatment division, public defense division, developmental disabilities division(~~(s)~~) and the children and family commission.

B. C(~~COMMUNITY SERVICES DIVISION~~) community services division. The duties of the division shall include the following:

1. Work in partnership with communities and other funders to develop, support and provide human services which emphasize prevention, early intervention, and community education, and which strengthen individuals, families(~~(s)~~) and communities in King County;

1 2. Manage programs which increase family self-sufficiency, enhance youth
 2 resiliency, reduce community violence((,)) and strengthen communities. The division shall
 3 also manage programs which address housing and community development needs, and help
 4 implement improvements identified in subarea and neighborhood plans for low and
 5 moderate income communities and population. Such programs are to include, but not be
 6 limited to, providing employment and training for youth and adults and providing
 7 assistance to indigent veterans and their families as authorized by ((RCW)) chapters 41.02
 8 and ((RCW)) 73.08 RCW. This division shall administer the county's federal housing and
 9 community development funds and other housing and community development programs;
 10 and

11 3. Develop housing and community development policies and programs to
 12 implement the growth management policies throughout King County to provide affordable
 13 housing to low and moderate income residents.

14 C. M(~~(ENTAL HEALTH DIVISION)~~)ental health (~~((and substance abuse services))~~)
 15 division. The duties of this division shall include the following:

16 1. Manage and operate a system of mental health services for acutely
 17 disturbed, seriously disturbed((,)) and chronically mentally ill children and adults;

18 ~~((3))~~2. Manage and operate a ((24))twenty-four-hour crisis response system,
 19 including civil commitment as a last resort;

20 3. Select appropriate agencies for the provision of mental health services and
 21 develop, implement((,)) and monitor the provision and outcomes of contracted services;

22 4. Be responsible for resource management of a comprehensive mental health
 23 and substance abuse services system including provision of staff support to appropriate

1 advisory and boards, and serve as liaison to federal, state((,)) and other governments and
 2 relevant organizations in carrying out planning and allocation processes.

3 D. Alcohol and substance abuse treatment services division. This division shall ((P))
 4 provide treatment and rehabilitation service for alcoholism and for other drug addictions
 5 under federal and state laws and King County ordinances.

6 PROVIDED THAT:

7 The executive shall submit to the council no later than March 31, 1999 a proposal
 8 for integrating some or all of the alcohol and substance abuse treatment division with the
 9 mental health division.

10 ~~((D))~~E. P(~~UBLIC DEFENSE DIVISION~~)ublic defense division. The duties of the
 11 division shall include those duties specified in K.C.C. chapter 2.60.

12 ~~((E))~~F. D(~~EVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES DIVISION~~)velopmental
 13 disabilities division. The duties of this division shall include the following:

14 1. Manage and operate a system of services for persons with developmental
 15 disabilities in accordance with relevant state statutes and county policies and to provide
 16 staff support to the King County board for developmental disabilities; and

17 2. Negotiate, implement((,)) and monitor contracts with community agencies for the
 18 provision of developmental disabilities services.

19 SECTION 2. Ordinance 12529, Section 2, and K.C.C 2.16.080 are hereby amended
 20 to read as follows:

21 **Seattle-King County department of public health.** A. D(~~EPARTMENT~~
 22 ~~ESTABLISHED~~)epartment established. Since 1951, the city of Seattle and the county
 23 have jointly financed and operated a city-county health department. As of January 1, 1981,

1 the city of Seattle and the county established a combined city-county health department
2 known as the Seattle-King County department of public health (~~((pursuant to))~~) under
3 chapters 70.05 and 70.08 RCW and certain city ordinances and county resolutions and
4 ordinances. The director of the department shall be jointly appointed by the mayor of the
5 city and the county executive, subject to confirmation by the city and county councils, and
6 may be removed by the county executive, after consultation with the mayor, upon filing a
7 statement of the reasons therefor with the city and county councils as authorized by RCW
8 70.08.040(~~(, as amended)~~). The director shall be responsible for the management of the
9 department.

10 B. R(~~(RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT)~~) responsibilities of the
11 department. As provided in the agreement between King County and the city of Seattle
12 entitled "1996 Agreement Regarding the Seattle-King County Department of Public
13 Health" approved by the county council by Motion 9999, the department shall be
14 responsible for providing a functionally integrated set of services and programs that are
15 fully responsive to urban, suburban city(~~(,)~~) and non(~~(-)~~) incorporated communities
16 throughout King County by providing public health services which promote health and
17 prevent disease, including, but not limited to(~~(,)~~); providing needed or mandated prevention
18 or intervention services to address individual and community health concerns; assessing
19 and monitoring the health status of communities; preventing disease, injury, disability and
20 premature death; promoting health living conditions and healthy behaviors; and controlling
21 and reducing the exposure of individuals and communities to environmental or personal
22 hazards. The department shall assess the health of King County residents and
23 communities, facilitate planning to develop responses to issues which affect the public's

1 health, and evaluate the effectiveness of programs and initiatives which address these
 2 issues. The department shall include an emergency medical services division, an
 3 environmental health division, a prevention division, a community oriented primary care
 4 division, an alcohol, tobacco and ~~((substance))~~ other drug abuse prevention division, an
 5 administrative services division~~((,))~~ and regional services areas.

6 ~~((PROVIDED THAT:~~

7 ~~By June 30, 1997, the executive shall submit for council review and approval a proposal to~~
 8 ~~create a new behavioral health program which combines at least portions if not all of the~~
 9 ~~existing mental health and alcohol and substance abuse programs.~~

10 ~~Under the authority of the director, the division managers shall oversee the development~~
 11 ~~and implementation of technical and practice standards in the respective areas of~~
 12 ~~expertise.))~~

13 C. E~~((MERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DIVISION))~~ emergency medical services
 14 division. To fulfill the purpose of reducing death and disability from accidents, acute
 15 illness, injuries and other medical emergencies, the duties of the division shall include the
 16 following;

17 1. Track and analyze service and program needs of the emergency medical
 18 services system in the county, and plan and implement emergency medical programs,
 19 services~~((,))~~ and delivery systems based on uniform data and standard emergency medical
 20 incident reporting;

21 2. Set standards for emergency medical services training and implement
 22 emergency medical service personnel training programs, including, but not limited to,

1 public education, communication and response capabilities((§)) and transportation of the
 2 sick and injured;

3 3. Coordinate all aspects of emergency medical services in the county with
 4 local, state and federal governments, other counties, municipalities and special districts for
 5 the purpose of improving the quality and quantity of emergency medical services and
 6 disaster response in King County; and

7 4. Analyze and coordinate the disaster response capabilities of the department.

8 D. E(~~(ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIVISION)~~)environmental health division. The
 9 duties of the division shall include the following:

10 1. Inspect and monitor regulated facilities to ensure compliance with public
 11 health codes, rules and regulations;

12 2. Investigate complaints or special programs (~~((e.g.))~~), such as disease
 13 outbreaks, sewage spills((§)) or toxic spills((§))₂ identified by the public, the media or public
 14 officials;

15 3. Advise or educate the public on health risks associated with environmental
 16 hazards; and

17 4. Enforce public health codes, rules and regulations within the jurisdictions of
 18 the division.

19 E. P(~~(PREVENTION DIVISION)~~)revention division. The duties of the division shall
 20 include the following:

21 1. Reduce the public's exposure to communicable diseases through
 22 surveillance and outbreak investigation;

1 2. Lower the occurrence of chronic diseases, injury and violence the
2 community through strategies which reduce the frequency of risk factors for these
3 conditions;

4 3. Promote and provide public education and research in the development of
5 prevention models;

6 4. Perform specific public health services including vital statistics and
7 laboratory functions; and

8 5. Perform medical examiner and statutory coroner duties, except for the
9 holding of inquests, which function is vested in the county executive.

10 F. C(~~COMMUNITY ORIENTED PRIMARY CARE DIVISION~~) ommunity oriented
11 primary care division. The division shall focus the department's clinical leadership, health
12 services(~~(,)~~) and expertise and strengthens quality systems and effective care partnerships
13 with government, business and community-based organizations. To maintain the
14 community health care system, the duties of the division shall include the following:

15 1. Develop benchmarks of service quality, clinical guidelines and standards of
16 excellence for the health department;

17 2. Provide leadership and coordination with health care providers, government
18 agencies, business and community groups in the provision of primary health services to at-
19 risk populations in King County;

20 3. Develop, implement and monitor a systematic, comprehensive system of
21 health service delivery in King County which improves health outcomes by connecting
22 community-based intervention and strategies with the health care of individuals;

1 4. Develop responsive service delivery and access mechanisms to meet the
2 changing health care needs of at-risk populations in King County; and

3 5. Provide basic primary care services to detainees of the King County adult
4 detention facilities.

5 G. A(~~(ALCOHOL AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE DIVISION)~~)lcohol, tobacco and other
6 drug abuse prevention division. The duties of the division shall include the following:

7 1. Administer, staff(~~(,)~~) and provide technical expertise to department
8 programs related to the prevention (~~((and treatment))~~) of alcoholism and substance abuse;

9 2. Provide prevention services on alcoholism and other drug addictions
10 (~~((pursuant to))~~) under federal and state laws and King County ordinances; (~~((and))~~)

11 3. (~~((Provide for the delivery of services in outpatient, 24-hour residential~~
12 ~~programs and/or inpatient settings either directly or by contract))~~) Link and integrate
13 alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse interventions with public health functions and
14 activities; and

15 4. Provide for the delivery of alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse services in
16 correctional facilities.

17 H. A(~~(ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIVISION)~~)ministrative services division.

18 The duties of the division shall include the following:

19 1. Provide administrative and technical support to the department;

20 2. Oversee the administrative systems and activities of the department; and

21 3. Provide general support within the department as authorized elsewhere in
22 this chapter.

1 I. R(~~REGIONAL SERVICE AREAS~~)egional service areas. In addition to
 2 divisions, the department shall be organized into regional service areas that will directly
 3 provide department activities, services and programs within identified geographic
 4 boundaries in the county.

5 SECTION 3. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4.08 a new section to read as
 6 follows:

7 There is hereby created the alcohol and substance abuse services fund. This fund
 8 shall be a second tier fund managed by the department of community and human services.

9 The alcohol and substance abuse services fund shall be used to collect revenue from
 10 state and other funding sources and to expend funds for alcohol and substance abuse
 11 services and related administration under an annual appropriation.

12 SECTION 4. Ordinance 12076, Section 10, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.08.025 are
 13 hereby amended to read as follows:

14 **Second tier funds and designated fund managers.** Second tier funds and fund
 15 managers are as follows, except to the extent that all or a portion of any listed fund is a first
 16 tier fund by virtue of any other provision of this chapter or other ordinance:


