AN ORDINANCE making supplemental appropriations of \$2,075,928 to the grants fund, of \$100,000 to developmental disabilities fund and of \$2,621,380 to mental health, chemical abuse and dependency services fund from various grants; and amending the 1999 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 13340, Sections 75, 84 and 94, as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted supplemental appropriations

of:

A. \$100,000 to developmental disabilities for "one-time" improvements in infant

13

toddler early intervention program services, from state of Washington revenue contracts;

B. \$2,621,380 to the mental health, chemical abuse and dependency services

15

division from a grant from the Washington state Department of Social and Health Services,

16

for providing chemical dependency treatment services to eligible clients in King County for

17

the period starting July 1999; and

C.1. \$32,000 to the grants fund from the Washington state Department of

Transportation to the office of emergency management to identify lifeline routes in all

jurisdictions of King County;

2. \$5,000 to the grants fund from the Washington state Military Department to fund the Third Annual Western Washington Emergency Management Conference;

3. \$30,000 to the grants fund to fund a juvenile justice disproportionality study, administered by the superior court, with grants from:

a. A \$10,000 grant from the Governor’s Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee;

b. A \$10,000 grant from US West Foundation; and

c. A \$10,000 grant from Safeco;

4. \$146,000 to the grants fund from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, to fund the partnership effort within the office of public defense to reduce racial disparity in the justice system in King County. This is an eighteen-month grant.

5. \$1,862,928 to the grants fund from the Washington State Department of Transportation for commute trip reduction law implementation within King County, as authorized by chapter 70.94 RCW.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 13340, Section 75, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES - From the developmental disabilities fund there is hereby appropriated to:

Developmental disabilities \$100,000

SECTION 3. Ordinance 13340, Section 84, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:






