1 AN ORDINANCE making a supplemental appropriation of
2 \$791,865 to the records and elections division from \$684,915 in
3 additional revenues generated from reimbursements from other
4 jurisdictions to pay for unbudgeted actual costs of conducting
5 special elections in 2000 and from \$106,950 current expense
6 fund balance for additional cost incurred by a senatorial race
7 recount in the general election, and making a supplemental
8 appropriation of \$1,350,158 to adult and juvenile detention to
9 pay for the labor settlement of the corrections guild contract; and
10 amending the 2000 Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 13678, Section
11 28 and 44, as amended, and declaring an emergency.

13 SECTION 1. Findings:

14 A. The King County Corrections Guild and King County have recently signed a
15 collective bargaining agreement for the period of January 1, 2001, through December 31,
16 2003, and a memorandum of understanding rolling over the existing agreement for the

17 period of January 1, 2000 through December 31, 2000. The agreement and memorandum
18 of understanding cover 586 employees in the department of adult and juvenile detention.

19 B. King County executive Ron Sims and King County Corrections Guild
20 president Karen Caldwell signed the negotiated collective bargaining agreement and the
21 memorandum of understanding on October 17, 2000.

22 C. The King County council adopted the ordinance approving the collective
23 bargaining agreement and memorandum of understanding on November 6, 2000.

24 D. The bargaining unit employees are legally entitled to receive back pay for
25 2000 pursuant to the terms of the approved memorandum of understanding and collective
26 bargaining agreement, however, the funds necessary for these payments have not yet
27 been appropriated. To make it possible for these payments to be made promptly, it is
28 necessary to enact this ordinance as an emergency ordinance to enable the executive
29 branch to process payments in a timely manner. The council finds that it is necessary for
30 the support of county government to provide for timely payment to affected employees
31 through enactment of this ordinance.

32 SECTION 2. There is hereby approved and adopted a supplemental appropriation
33 of \$791,865 to the records and elections division from \$684,915 in additional revenues
34 generated from reimbursements from other jurisdictions to pay for unbudgeted actual
35 costs of conducting special elections in 2000 and from \$106,950 current expense fund
36 balance for additional costs incurred by a senatorial race recount in the general election.

37 SECTION 3. Ordinance 13678, Section 28, as amended, is hereby amended by
38 adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

47 SECTION 5. Emergency. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an
48 emergency exists and that the enactment of this ordinance is necessary for the immediate
49 preservation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county government and
50 its existing public institutions.


