1 AN ORDINANCE eliminating the date for transmittal of
2 appointments of members to the King County citizens'
3 elections oversight committee; and amending Ordinance
4 14711, Section 2, as amended.

7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

8 SECTION 1. Ordinance 14711, Section 2, as amended, is hereby amended to
9 read as follows:

10 **Membership – appointment process, requirements and restrictions.**

11 A. The committee shall consist of thirteen voting members. The members shall
12 be appointed by the executive from nominations submitted by the chair of the council.

13 The appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the council.

14 B. Membership shall include:

15 1. One representative from each of the following:

- 16 a. The Municipal League;
17 b. The League of Women Voters;

- 18 c. The King County Democratic Party;
- 19 d. The Washington state Democratic Party;
- 20 e. The King County Republican Party;
- 21 f. The Washington state Republican Party;
- 22 g. The Libertarian Party;
- 23 h. The Office of the Secretary of State;
- 24 i. A King County school district; and
- 25 j. The Chinese-speaking community; and
- 26 2. Three King County registered voters.

27 C. All nominees should have:

- 28 1. Substantial working knowledge of local or state government elections
29 operations and management;
- 30 2. A strong commitment to an accountable, transparent, well-managed and
31 efficient elections operation in King County; and
- 32 3. A willingness to commit the time necessary to attend committee meetings and
33 activities.

34 D. A nominee or appointee shall not hold or be a candidate for elected office,
35 except that precinct committee officers may serve on the committee.

36 E. For the purpose of serving on this committee, members need not be residents
37 of King County((;)).

38 F. The chair of the council shall submit nominations to the executive. The
39 executive shall transmit to the council thirteen appointments to the committee ((by

40 ~~September 15, 2003~~). The transmittal shall be accompanied by appropriate contact
41 information for the appointees.

42 G. Terms of committee membership shall be eight months and shall not be for
43 staggered terms.




