BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 14214, Section 8, and K.C.C. 9.14.070 are each hereby

amended to read as follows:

**Vashon-Maury island groundwater protection committee.** The Vashon-Maury

13

island groundwater protection committee is hereby created and shall continue in existence

14

until December 31, ((2004)) 2009. The Vashon-Maury island groundwater protection

15

committee shall be referred to as "the groundwater protection committee" or "the

16

committee" throughout this ((chapter)) section.

17           A. The groundwater protection committee members shall be selected from within  
18 the Vashon-Maury island groundwater management plan area and shall consist of the  
19 following representatives:

- 20           1. One representative from the groundwater advisory committee;
- 21           2. One representative from water purveyors;
- 22           3. Two representatives from sewer and water utilities and associations;
- 23           4. One representative from residential well users;
- 24           5. One representative from business owners;
- 25           6. One representative from commercial agriculturists;
- 26           7. One representative from the unincorporated area council;
- 27           8. One representative from chambers of commerce; and
- 28           9. One representative from local environmental organizations.

29           B. The county shall invite each of the tribal nations with federally recognized  
30 rights within the Vashon-Maury island groundwater management area to recommend  
31 candidates for the committee. The committee shall include a representative from each  
32 tribal nation with federally recognized rights within the Vashon-Maury island  
33 groundwater management area, (~~provided that~~) if the tribal nation provides to the  
34 county a candidate for appointment to the committee.

35           C. Each county abutting the Vashon-Maury island groundwater management plan  
36 area boundary shall be requested to provide to the county a candidate for appointment to  
37 the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis;

38 D. The Seattle-King County department of public health and the Washington  
39 state departments of Ecology and Health shall be requested to provide to the county a  
40 candidate for appointment to the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis; and

41 E. Each member of the committee shall coordinate internally with the entity the  
42 member represents.

43 SECTION 2. Ordinance 14214, Section 9, and K.C.C. 9.14.080 are each hereby  
44 amended to read as follows:

45 **East King County groundwater protection committee.** The east King County  
46 groundwater protection committee is hereby created and shall continue in existence until  
47 December 31, ~~((2004))~~ 2009. The east King County groundwater protection committee  
48 shall be referred to as "the groundwater protection committee" or "the committee"  
49 throughout this ~~((chapter))~~ section.

50 A. The groundwater protection committee members shall be selected from within  
51 the east King County groundwater management plan area and shall consist of the  
52 following representatives:

- 53 1. One representative from the groundwater advisory committee;
- 54 2. One representative from water purveyors;
- 55 3. Two representatives from sewer and water utilities and associations;
- 56 4. One representative from residential well users;
- 57 5. One representative from business owners;
- 58 6. One representative from commercial agriculturists;
- 59 7. One representative from each city;
- 60 8. One representative from the unincorporated area council;

61           9. One representative from chambers of commerce; and

62           10. One representative from local environmental organizations.

63           B. The county shall invite each of the tribal nations with federally recognized  
64 rights within the east King County groundwater management area to recommend  
65 candidates for the committee. The committee shall include a representative from each  
66 tribal nation with federally recognized rights within the east King County groundwater  
67 management area, (~~provided that~~) if the tribal nation provides to the county a candidate  
68 for appointment to the committee.

69           C. Each county abutting the east King County groundwater management plan  
70 area boundary shall be requested to provide to the county a candidate for appointment to  
71 the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis;

72           D. The Seattle-King County department of public health and the Washington  
73 state departments of Ecology and Health shall be requested to provide to the county a  
74 candidate for appointment to the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis; and

75           E. Each member of the committee shall coordinate internally with the entity the  
76 member represents.

77           SECTION 3. Ordinance 14214, Section 10, and K.C.C. 9.14.090 are each hereby  
78 amended to read as follows:

79           **Issaquah creek valley groundwater protection committee.** The Issaquah creek  
80 valley groundwater protection committee is hereby created and shall continue in  
81 existence until December 31, (~~2004~~) 2009. The Issaquah creek valley groundwater  
82 protection committee shall be referred to as "the groundwater protection committee" or  
83 "the committee" throughout this (~~chapter~~) section.

84           A. The groundwater protection committee members shall be selected from within  
85 the Issaquah creek valley groundwater management plan area and shall consist of the  
86 following representatives:

- 87           1. One representative from the groundwater advisory committee;
- 88           2. One representative from water purveyors;
- 89           3. Two representatives from sewer and water utilities and associations;
- 90           4. One representative from residential well users;
- 91           5. One representative from business owners;
- 92           6. One representative from commercial agriculturists;
- 93           7. One representative from each city;
- 94           8. One representative from the unincorporated area council;
- 95           9. One representative from chambers of commerce; and
- 96           10. One representative from local environmental organizations.

97           B. The county shall invite each of the tribal nations with federally recognized  
98 rights within the Issaquah creek valley groundwater management area to recommend  
99 candidates for the committee. The committee shall include a representative from each  
100 tribal nation with federally recognized rights within the Issaquah creek valley  
101 groundwater management area, (~~provided that~~) if the tribal nation provides to the  
102 county a candidate for appointment to the committee.

103           C. The Seattle-King County department of public health and the Washington  
104 state departments of Ecology and Health shall be requested to provide to the county a  
105 candidate for appointment to the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis; and

106 D. Each member of the committee shall coordinate internally with the entity the  
107 member represents.

108 SECTION 4. Ordinance 14276, Section 1, and K.C.C. 9.14.095 are each hereby  
109 amended to read as follows:

110 **Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater protection committee.** The Redmond-  
111 Bear Creek groundwater protection committee is hereby created and shall continue in  
112 existence until December 31, ((2004)) 2009. The Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater  
113 protection committee shall be referred to as "the groundwater protection committee" or  
114 "the committee" throughout this ((chapter)) section.

115 A. The groundwater protection committee members shall be selected from within  
116 the Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater management plan area and shall consist of the  
117 following representatives:

- 118 1. One representative from the groundwater advisory committee;
- 119 2. One representative from water purveyors;
- 120 3. Two representatives from sewer and water utilities and associations;
- 121 4. One representative from residential well users;
- 122 5. One representative from business owners;
- 123 6. One representative from commercial agriculturists;
- 124 7. One representative from each city;
- 125 8. One representative from the unincorporated area council;
- 126 9. One representative from chambers of commerce; and
- 127 10. One representative from local environmental organizations.

128 B. The county shall invite each of the tribal nations with federally recognized  
129 rights within the Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater management area to recommend  
130 candidates for the committee. The committee shall include a representative from each  
131 tribal nation with federally recognized rights within the Redmond-Bear Creek  
132 groundwater management area, ~~((provided that))~~ if the tribal nation provides to the  
133 county a candidate for appointment to the committee.

134 C. Each county abutting the Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater management  
135 plan area boundary shall be requested to provide to the county a candidate for  
136 appointment to the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis;

137 D. The Seattle-King County department of public health and the Washington  
138 state departments of Ecology and Health shall be requested to provide to the county a  
139 candidate for appointment to the committee on an advisory, nonvoting basis; and

140 E. Each member of the committee shall coordinate internally with the entity the  
141 member represents.

142 SECTION 5. Ordinance 14214, Section 12, and K.C.C. 9.14.110 are each hereby  
143 amended to read as follows:

144 **Groundwater protection committee - appointment - vacancies.**

145 A. The executive shall ~~((appoint members of the))~~ make initial appointments to a  
146 groundwater protection committee, subject to confirmation by the King County council  
147 by motion, with members serving staggered terms of not more than three years. The  
148 executive shall appoint members from candidates recommended by the council member  
149 or members representing the council district or districts in which the groundwater  
150 management planning area is located.

151           B. (~~Beginning January 1, 2002~~) Except as otherwise provided in subsection C.  
152 of this section, the executive shall appoint any member filling a vacancy on a  
153 groundwater protection committee, subject to confirmation by the King County council  
154 by motion, in accordance with K.C.C. chapter 2.28.




155 C. The representatives for each city on the Redmond-Bear Creek groundwater


Ordinance 15082 was introduced on 10/25/2004 and passed as amended by the Metropolitan King County Council on 11/22/2004, by the following vote:


