1 AN ORDINANCE approving the City of Kent 2011 Water
2 System Plan.

3 STATEMENT OF FACTS:

4 1. King County has adopted K.C.C. chapter 13.24, which requires
5 approval of comprehensive plans for water utilities that distribute or obtain
6 water in unincorporated King County as a prerequisite for operating in
7 unincorporated King County, receiving approval for annexation proposals,
8 being granted right-of-way franchises, and being given approval for right-
9 of-way construction permits. K.C.C. 13.24.060 prescribes the
10 requirements for approval of such plans, including consistency with state
11 and local planning requirements.

12 2. RCW 70.116.050 requires that general comprehensive plans for water
13 within critical water supply service areas be submitted to, and approved
14 by, the legislative authority within whose boundaries all or a portion of a
15 utility lies.

16 3. The city's service area is within a critical water supply service area and
17 has adopted a water system plan ("the plan").

18 4. King County has adopted a Comprehensive Plan that includes water
19 supply policies in its provisions for facilities and services (policies F-101

20 through F-254) that call for consistency with other adopted plans, support
21 for regional water supply planning, pursuit of reclaimed water, water
22 conservation and protection of water resources.

23 5. K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires the utilities technical review committee
24 ("the UTRC") to review and make a recommendation to the King County
25 executive and council on the plan and the requirements under K.C.C.
26 chapter 13.24 and consistency with the King County Comprehensive Plan.
27 The UTRC has reviewed the planning data and city operations and has
28 found:

29 a. The plan uses population and employment forecasts developed by the
30 Puget Sound Regional Council for the city's service area;

31 b. Portions of the city's service area are in unincorporated King County;

32 c. The capital facility plan is adequate to meet anticipated facility and
33 service needs;

34 d. The plan is consistent with applicable Washington state water quality
35 laws, including the evaluation of reclaimed water use; and

36 e. The plan is consistent with other pertinent county adopted plans and
37 policies.

38 6. The Washington state Department of Health has approved the city's
39 plan.

40 7. Under the state Environmental Policy Act the city issued an addendum
41 to an existing environmental review for the issuance of the plan on June 4,
42 2012, and there were no appeals.

43 8. The city's operations and facilities meet multiple existing statutory,
44 administrative and planning standards. As the city's operations, facilities
45 and planning meet the requirements of the King County Code, and are
46 consistent with the King County Comprehensive Plan, the UTRC has
47 recommended approval of the plan.

48 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

49 SECTION 1. The City of Kent 2011 Water System Plan, Attachment A to this
50 ordinance, is hereby approved as a water system plan.
