1 AN ORDINANCE consolidating funds relating to housing
2 and community development; amending Ordinance 17752,
3 Section 12, and K.C.C. 4A.200.297, adding a new section
4 to K.C.C. chapter 4A.200, codifying K.C.C. 4A.200.297
5 and repealing Ordinance 9368, Sections 1-2, as amended,
6 and K.C.C. 4A.200.360.

7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

8 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this ordinance takes effect June 30, 2017.

9 SECTION 2. Ordinance 9368, Sections 1-2, as amended, and K.C.C. 4A.200.360
10 are each hereby repealed.

11 SECTION 3. K.C.C. 4A.200.297, as amended by this ordinance, is hereby
12 recodified as a new section in K.C.C. chapter 4A.200.

13 SECTION 4. Ordinance 17752, Section 12, and K.C.C. 4A.200.297 are each
14 hereby amended to read as follows:

15 A. There is hereby created the ((federal)) housing and community development
16 fund.

17 B. The fund shall be a ((second)) first tier fund. It is a special revenue fund.

18 C. The director of the department of community and human services shall be the
19 manager of the fund.

20 D.1. The fund shall be used to collect revenue from federal, state and other
21 funding sources ~~((and)) to ((expend direct costs and related administration))~~ support
22 housing and community development projects.

23 2. Moneys in the fund shall be expended consistent with applicable funding
24 sources to support:

25 (a) ((non-county)) noncounty organization((s)) projects that acquire, renovate
26 or construct housing for very low to moderate-income individuals and families, including
27 homeless households and households with special housing needs ~~((by securing));~~

28 (b) operating costs for housing projects identified in subsection D.2.a. of this
29 section, rental assistance and services for low-income individuals and families, including
30 homeless households and households with special housing needs;

31 (c) noncounty organization projects related to community development
32 activities; and

33 (d) county costs to administer this fund.


34 3. When moneys in the fund are used to support housing projects identified in
35 subsection D.2.a. of this section, the noncounty organization shall grant King County a
36 property interest in the housing project, in a form acceptable to the county. ~~((The fund~~
37 ~~may also support housing operating costs, rental assistance and services for low income~~

38 ~~individuals and families, including homeless households and households with special~~
39 ~~housing needs.))~~
