1 AN ORDINANCE ratifying the executive emergency
 2 budget crisis proclamation for the 2021-2022 biennium
 3 budget cycle.

4 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

5 **SECTION 1. Findings:**

6 A. On February 29, 2020, the Governor of Washington state declared a state of
 7 emergency in all counties in Washington state and directed that the plans and procedures
 8 of the Washington State Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan be implemented
 9 as a result of coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") outbreak and confirmation of
 10 person-to-person spread in Washington state.

11 B. COVID-19 is a respiratory disease that is classified by the World Health
 12 Organization as a pandemic that spreads easily from person to person and may result in
 13 serious illness or death.

14 C. On March 1, 2020, the executive issued a proclamation of emergency enabling
 15 extraordinary measures to respond to the COVID-19 outbreak. On March 3, 2020, the
 16 council passed Motion 15610, affirming the proclamation of emergency.

17 D. As a result of the continued worldwide spread of COVID-19, its significant
 18 progression in Washington state and the high risk it poses to our most-vulnerable
 19 populations, on March 23, 2020, the Governor issued a "Stay Home - Stay Healthy" order

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20 prohibiting, with limited exceptions, all people in Washington state from leaving their
21 homes or participating in social, spiritual and recreational gatherings of any kind
22 regardless of the number of participants, and required all nonessential businesses in
23 Washington state to cease operations except for performing basic minimal operations. In
24 describing COVID-19's impact on public health and the economy, the order noted the
25 pandemic's progression in Washington state that continues to threaten the economy and
26 remains a public disaster affecting life, health, property or the public peace. The order
27 has been extended twice, with the last extension expiring May 31, 2020.

28 E. On May 31, 2020, the Governor reiterated that a State of Emergency continues
29 to exist but amended the "Stay Home - Stay Healthy" proclamation and renamed it the
30 "Safe Start - Stay Healthy" proclamation, and that except as provided in the phased
31 county reopening plan, all other provisions of the State of Emergency remain in force.

32 F. The Stay Home - Stay Healthy order and the related public safety preventative
33 measures, including social distancing are causing devastating economic effects in
34 Washington and across the nation.

35 G. On June 5, 2020, King County entered Modified Phase 1 of the Safe Start
36 Plan. Then, on June 19, 2020, King County entered Phase 2 of the Safe Start Plan. On
37 July 28, 2020, the Governor paused counties progressing in the reopening phases under
38 the state's Safe Start plan due to continued rise of cases and spread of COVID-19
39 statewide. The pause will continue indefinitely. King County is currently in the high-
40 risk category for disease transmission with 80 cases per 100,000 residents based on
41 county data for the past two weeks.

42 H. The county is experiencing extraordinary and unprecedented economic

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43 conditions and severe fiscal challenges across all county funds, which is resulting in a
44 significant shortfall in the amount of funding needed to sustain the current level of
45 general operations through 2022.

46 I. On May 29, 2020 the executive issued a proclamation declaring a budget
47 emergency for the remainder of the 2019-2020 biennium budget cycle. On June 23,
48 2020, the council ratified the proclamation.

49 J. With reduced revenues forecasted through 2022 and thereafter, the county is
50 working hard to find innovative ways to gain efficiencies in all county functions in order
51 to minimize service reductions to the public.

52 K. The current circumstance is such that projected county revenues are forecasted
53 and determined to be insufficient to fully fund county agency operations and significant
54 costs savings must be achieved through reductions in service and pay.

55 SECTION 2. The executive has proclaimed that an emergency budget crisis

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56 exists for the 2021-2022 biennium budget cycle. The council hereby ratifies the
57 executive's proclamation.
