

Transit Superintendent-Rail Vehicle Maintenance

Job Description

Job Duties: In addition to the general job duties listed in the job announcement, the Superintendent for Rail Vehicle Maintenance is expected to model and apply our equity and social justice shared values, behaviors, and practices across all the job duties listed below:

- Provide leadership, management, administration, and resource allocation for the fleet maintenance operations that are critical to providing reliable Link light rail service to the King County service area.
- Oversees and directs a team of approximately 70 Rail service workers, Rail Electro-Mechanics, Administrative staff, and Transit Chiefs
- Implement portions of System Safety Program Plan and participate in the State Safety Oversight annual and triennial audit program
- Coordinate and lead all light rail vehicle maintenance activities; Oversee and manage any fleet modifications for light rail; responsible for managing a fleet of non-revenue support automobiles
- Work with vehicle manufacturer to identify, track and resolve fleet defect and warranty issues
- Coordinate with the Maintenance Service Center that is responsible for parts inventory, purchasing and procurement to ensure parts are ordered and adequate materials are available to support vehicle maintenance projects
- Responsible for emergency management operations at the work site and remain on call 24 hours per day
- Direct (through subordinate supervisors) a work force involved in preventive maintenance, repair, emergency re-railing and servicing of light rail cars and streetcars to meet daily schedules

Minimum Qualifications: In addition to the minimum qualifications outlined in the job announcement, applicants must also meet these minimum qualifications to be considered for the role:

- Must possess knowledge of the design or maintenance of components, systems and equipment of light rail or transit vehicles

Desirable qualifications: in addition to the desirable qualifications outlined in the job announcement, our most competitive applicants for this role will have:

- Knowledge of the principles, practices and industry standards that support effective and cost-efficient preventive maintenance and repair of light rail revenue vehicles
- Knowledge of fleet procurement processes, acceptance of vehicles, warranty administration
- A Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical or Industrial Engineering or related field (or equivalent combination of related education and supervisory or administrative experience)
