The main access point for Black Diamond Open Space is a gravel parking lot on the **east side of SR 169** South of Maple Valley. The parking lot can accommodate cars, trucks and horse trailers.

There is an additional, smaller gravel parking lot on the **west side of SR 169** in the same location. The western parking lot can accommodate cars.



BLACK DIAMOND OPEN SPACE

Black Diamond Open Space is a 1,160-acre park located between the cities of Maple Valley and Black Diamond in King County. It is a multi-use King County park managed as three geographic units: north, southwest, and southeast. This map brochure covers the north unit, the largest and most publicly used portion of Black Diamond Open Space. The park is forested, with several high-quality bogs and wetlands that provide good habitat for wildlife. The park also has an extensive trail system that has nearly 25 miles of multi-use trails.



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
