Dear Friends and Neighbors:

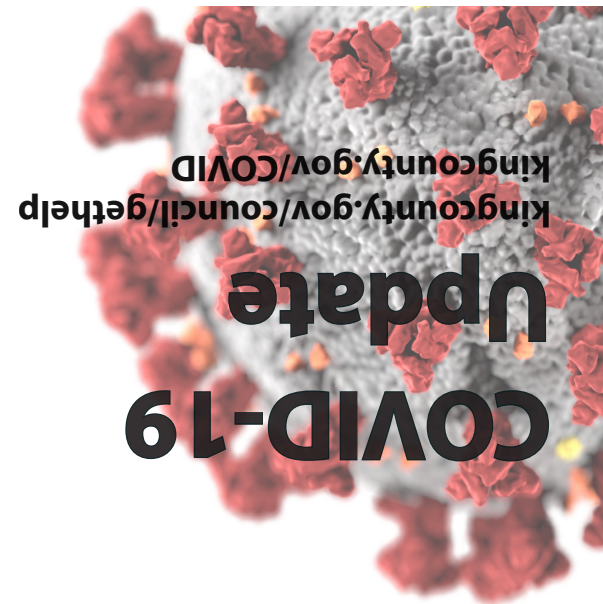

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The King County Council's Action on COVID-19

This past February, King County found itself at the epicenter of a nation-wide public health crisis. Since then, the King County Council has been solely focused on the COVID-19 response. Councilmember Dunn supported legislative action such as:

\$28.2 million in emergency funding for Public Health

\$2.2 million for free childcare for first responders and essential workers

\$3 million for economic development aid for small businesses, chambers of commerce, and cities

\$4 million in grants for small businesses in unincorporated King County

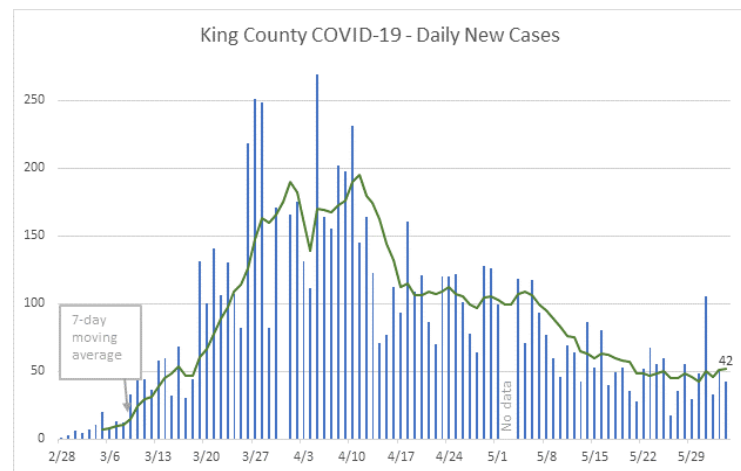

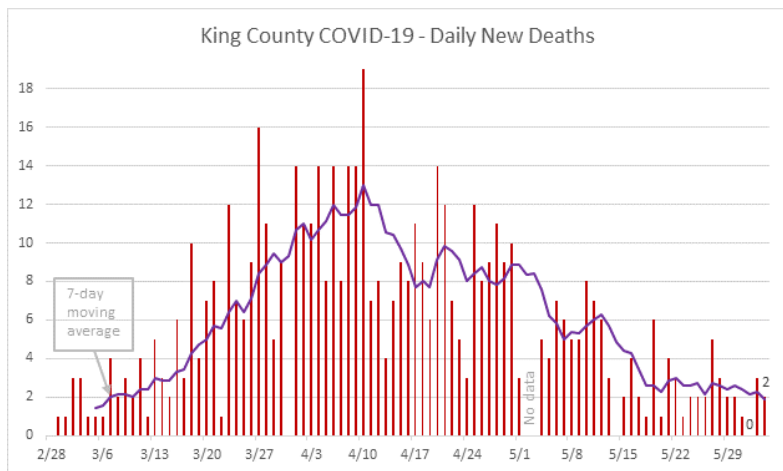

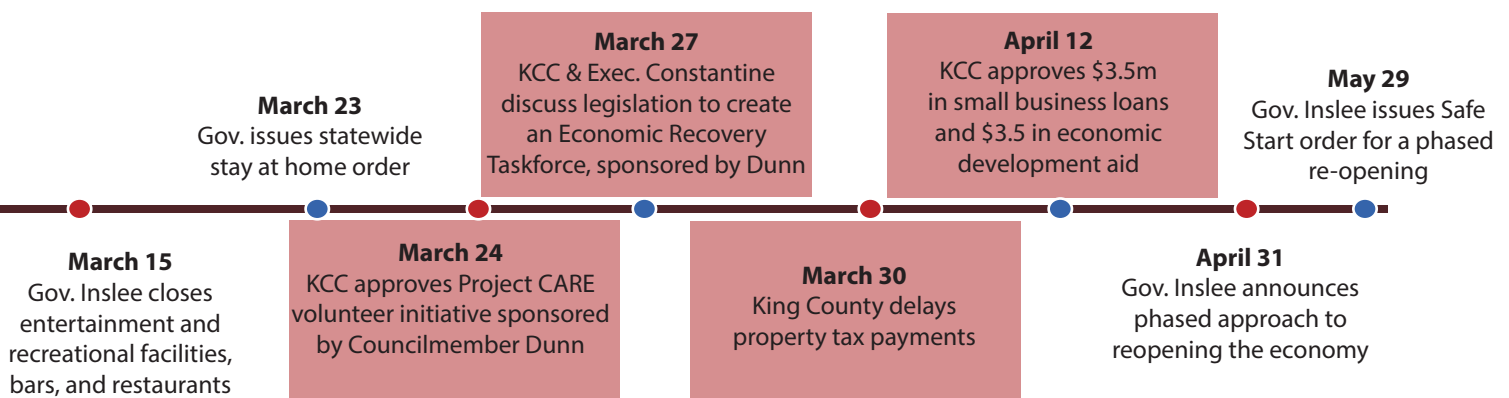
